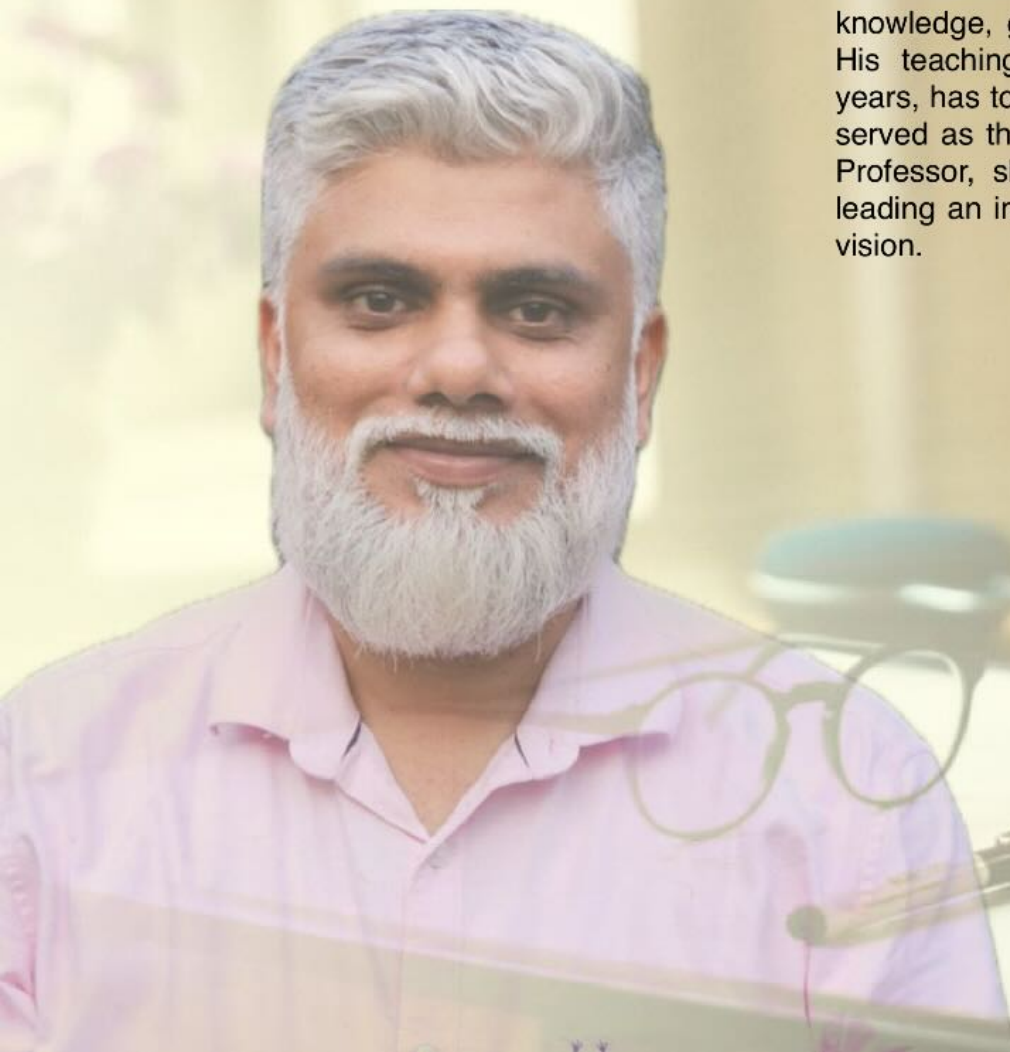


# *Life Dedicated to Language and Education*
